Safe Kids Week is May 30-June 5, 2016 !
We all have a role to play in teaching our children to be safe as they explore, discover, and creatively problem solve at home and in the great outdoors!

At Home and at Play: Set age appropriate guidelines and talk to your child about how to play with safety in mind, then let them get adventurous. Climbing trees, over rocks, running up hills or watching the clouds can all be fun activities.

On the Road: It is never too early to start talking to kids about pedestrian and bicycle safety. Kids under age of 10 do not have good depth perception or the ability to judge oncoming traffic speed. Teach your child how to safely cross roads and at traffic lights, watch for cars, and the dangers of texting while walking. When biking, ride with your child to help them learn to navigate safely around traffic, and make sure everyone wears a good fitting helmet.

## Dress Code



Now that the weather is getting warmer, please check that your child's clothing is appropriate for school. Halter tops, tube tops, see-through mesh shirts, short shorts/skirts, revealing tank tops and bare midriffs are great for the beach but not for school. Tops must not expose midriff and must be wide strapped ( 3 adult fingers wide). Shorts and skirts should come to the bottom of the child's fingers when arms are straight down at the sides.
