Jesus said, "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding the one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it" (Matthew 13:45 - 46).

Imagine spending your whole life searching for the most precious pearl. When you finally find it, how would you recognize it? Would searching for pearls help you learn something about them? What if we were to search in every situation, every moment in our lives, for the precious pearl that is the kingdom of God here on earth? Then, when we finally have eyes to see it, what must we "sell" before we can finally "buy" it? What can selling and buying even mean when we're speaking about the kingdom of God? Safe Arrival

The Safe Arrival Program at our school is to ensure the safety of all students placed within our care. If your child will be absent and/or late, we ask that you contact the school at 705-726-1221 before 9:00 am. If you are not able to speak to a person, our school answering machine is on 24 hours per day to accept your message. On bus cancellation days if your child is a walker or out of boundary and will not be attending, please leave a safe arrival message. We have to make numerous calls and the attendance is not completed until 11:00 am. Email safe arrival messages are also available. To leave an e-mail message, please visit our school website at scd.schools.smcdsb.on.ca, at the Quick Links menu pick safe arrival form and follow the instructions. Thank you for your assistance in sharing the responsibility of the safety of all children with us.

Winter Conditions

Please be advised that during cold spells we will monitor the appropriateness of the students being outside. Our general rule of thumb, provided by the Health Unit, is that during cold weather periods, if the temperature is -25 C or colder, or the wind chill factor is -28 C or below, students are to remain indoors. Please ensure that your children

are dressed appropriately for the weather. Snow pants, hats, warm boots and mittens are essential as the students are outside for up to twenty-five minutes during recess.

Snowballs

During the winter months, it is essential to leave all snow on the ground in the interest of student safety. Throwing or kicking snow at others is not acceptable behaviour for students at our school.

Inclement Weather Arrangements

If hazardous road conditions prevail before the school day begins, Sinton Transit, the company providing bus services for our school, will inform of any bus route cancellations prior to 7:00 a.m. on the following radio stations: ROCK 95 (FM), CHAY (93.1 FM) and B101.1 (101.1 FM).



We are in the "Central Region".

On such days, the school will be open at 8:44 a.m. to receive children. The decision to send children to school rests with the parent or guardian. The understanding is that the parent/guardian is responsible for transportation on these days when the buses are not running and are expected to pick up their children at 3:20 p.m. If the school should close early, the students will be sent home or to the predetermined location we have on record at the school. If that information is not provided, students will remain at the school until the parents pick them up.

Kindergarten Registration

Each year at this time, we start our planning for September's accommodation and staffing needs. If you have a son or daughter starting kindergarten for the first time, please call Mrs. Janette Prisciak, our school office administrator. For children starting Junior Kindergarten for the first time, they must be born in 2013 thereby making them 4 years of age on or before December 31, 2017. Children starting Senior Kindergarten for the first time, and who have not attended Junior Kindergarten, must be 5 years of age on or before December 31, 2017. Please bring this to the attention of all friends and relatives within our school boundaries with children at home attending kindergarten for the first time. The parent or parents of students being registered must be Roman Catholic to be eligible to support the school board and will be asked to provide a copy of their baptismal certificate. A Kindergarten Information Meeting will be scheduled for the spring. The date of this meeting will be announced in an upcoming newsletter. Registration forms will be available in February 2017.



The Grade 8 Graduation pictures will be taken on Monday, January 30th. Boys should be dressed in a shirt and tie and girls she be dressed in a white or off-white blouse. Proofs will be sent home for package selection.
